When Jane was a child she loved to learn about animals. As a young woman, Jane traveled to Africa, where she went to work for famed paleoanthropologist Dr. Louis Leakey. He asked her to study chimpanzees in Gombe in Tanzania, and she stayed there for four decades, learning about how chimpanzees lived. Today Jane works to inspire people to conserve the environment and protect animals. She has written books and received many honors and awards. In addition to the Jane Goodall Institute for Wildlife Research, Education, and Conservation, Jane has started a conservation club for young people called Roots and Shoots.




